

## ***UoNA Student Code of Conduct***

Students are expected to behave and treat others on campus as professional scholars. Students attend the University from all parts of the world and from many varied backgrounds. This diversity provides a rich environment for the free exploration and expression of ideas, and students are expected to participate fully and to uphold the right of others to do the same.

Students are expected to abide by all public laws and generally accepted professional standards, to comply with all regulations and policies of the University, and to conduct themselves professionally when interacting with fellow students, faculty, and staff. The University reserves the right to place a student on disciplinary warning, probation, suspension, or dismissal, who engages in unsatisfactory conduct such as dishonesty; failure to adhere to rules and regulations; destruction or theft of property; participation in activity that impinges on the rights of others; or possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs at any time on these premises.

Violations of conduct should be reported to the Director of Student Services. The Director, who



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**Academic Integrity.**

Includes plagiarism & all elements as defined in the policy. Faculty are required to submit a record of all violations and penalties to the VP of Academic Affairs.

**Collegial Responsibility.**

Includes (a) Timely submission of assignments and (b) Participation in scheduled class sessions or activities

**Consequences**

**1<sup>st</sup> violation of policy** - The professor will choose either the student to submit the assignment (to be used as a teaching opportunity) or a consultation with the VP of Academic Affairs and a reduced grade for the re-submission of the assignment outside of class sessions or a written academic warning from the faculty.

**2<sup>nd</sup> violation of policy** - The professor will choose either the student to submit the assignment with a reduced grade of 20% less than the consultation in the VP of Academic Affairs or a written academic warning for the assignment or a written academic warning outside of class sessions or a written academic warning.

**3<sup>rd</sup> violation of policy** - Professors will not allow a student to resubmit an assignment. A student may be allowed to resubmit an assignment in a reduced grade of 30% of the assigned grade for assignments or for the course drop with the student placing the student on academic warning. Professors are required to require remedial actions as determined by VP of Academic Affairs.

Further or non-compliance with all violations of policy may result in dismissal from the University.

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**Appeals Process.**

Students may submit a written request for an appeal if they have extenuating circumstances that occurred within two weeks of the occurrence. The request must be filed with a representative, one administrator from the University's system of appeal, while still maintaining compliance with all other policies. If the appeal has not been satisfactorily resolved, the student may appeal to the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs. The Vice Chancellor will review the appeal and make a final decision. The Vice Chancellor's decision is final and will be recorded in the student's academic record.
